

The Tudor rose is a traditional floral emblem of England representing the House of Tudor.

The War of the Roses was a series of battles and civil wars for control of the throne in England.

They were fought between two rival houses: The House of Lancaster and the House of York. The conflict lasted sporadically between 1455 and 1487.

Eventually, the House of Tudor was victorious after they inherit the House of Lancaster's claim and killed Richard III for the House of York at the Battle of Bosworth Field in 1485.

And so, the Tudor Rose became a familiar symbol throughout households in England.

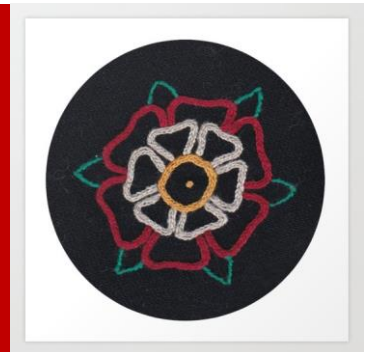

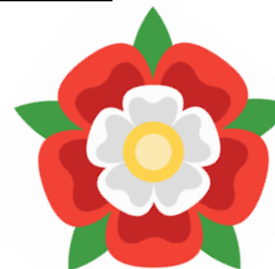
