



Vocabulary

Culture	The ideas, customs, and social behaviour of a particular people or society.
Conflict	A serious disagreement or argument, typically lasting for a long time or longer than expected or usual.
Discrimination	Is unfair treatment of a person or group of people. Usually the different treatment is because of the person's sex, religion, nationality, ethnicity (culture), race, or other personal traits.
Racism	It is discrimination or a negative judgement about someone due to their skin or their race and might include their beliefs or religion.
Homophobic	A range of negative attitudes and feelings toward homosexuality or people who are identified or perceived as being lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgender (LGBT).
Sexism	Is prejudice or discrimination based on a person's sex or gender.
Direct bullying	When bullying is done directly to the person. E.g. Pushed/hit/text/emailed.
Indirect bullying	Bullying that happens behind someone's back. E.g. Spreading rumours/whispering/stealing/Damaging another person's property without the person knowing who is doing it.
