The skills of potting and painting were often handed down from father to son. Signatures on vases suggest that many potters and painters did not have high status, and some may even have been slaves. The creation of pottery was laborious, dirty work that generally took place outside the city because of the space needed to make the vases and the thick smoke produced by the kilns.
