146 BC - Rome conquers Greece making it part of the Roman Empire

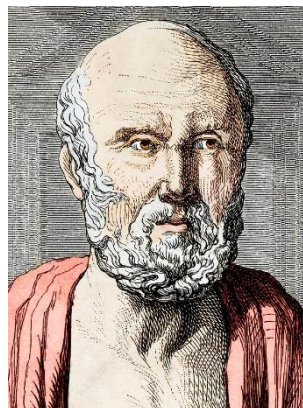
