



Vocabulary	
<b>Prejudice</b>	Occurs when we judge other people or groups without reason or knowledge, and often leads to unfair discrimination.
<b>Discrimination</b>	Is unfair treatment of one particular person or group of people. Usually the different treatment is because of the person's sex, religion, nationality, ethnicity (culture), race, or other personal traits.
<b>Transgender</b>	Describes people whose gender identity or expression does not match the sex they were assigned at birth.
<b>Stereotyping</b>	When people have a set idea about what someone or something is like, especially an idea that is wrong.
<b>Bullying</b>	An ongoing and deliberate misuse of power in relationships through repeated verbal, physical and/or social behaviour that intends to cause physical, social and/or psychological harm.
